For the most part, it's not that we have too little, but rather we have so much that we lose perspective on what it really means to have "want or need." I recall many years of law enforcement service where even those who appeared to be struggling with just about everything still had cell phones... and often times nicer phones than I had. Believe it or not, they regularly had food, and at times had enough to share with others. This is not so much a complaint as I am pleased to hear that we are caring for each other. The point is simply to show that we live in a country that has been blessed by the graciousness of God and the idea of legitimate suffering

often gets skewed.

To illustrate, there has been a story told of a young boy who loved the holidays and especially Christmas. With great anticipation he looked forward to receiving all of his Christmas gifts. The problem was... as the boy got older... the gifts started becoming more and more expensive. His list was always long, and this particular Christmas was no exception. His list had exactly 15 items and all of them were fairly expensive. Any one of the gifts would have made a fine gift, but he wanted them all. When Christmas came and the gifts were open, the young boy was so happy until he realized that he was missing one gift from the list. #### **Never Quit**

One of my favorite southern gospel songs growing up was "I'm Not Giving Up" by Gold City. As a youngster, when riding with my Dad, when this song came on the radio, he would always sing along with those low bass parts, (if you know you know) and I thought that Dad was the stuff being able to hit those notes with ease! What I didn't realize was that the melody I loved to hear my dad sing would help bring the lyrics back to my mind in some of the darkest days that I have faced. " I'm not giving up, I'm not turning 'round... I'll keep holding on, to that nail scarred hand..." are some of the lyrics found in the chorus.

We all get there, we all have had times when we feel like we can't go on. Jeremiah did too. He was a man of unyielding faith who faced tremendous trials yet remained steadfast in his commitment to God's calling. In Jeremiah 20, we witness the prophet's struggle as he endured persecution and ridicule for speaking God's truth to a rebellious nation. Despite the hardships he faced, Jeremiah refused to give up, trusting in the Lord's promises and remaining obedient to His will.

Just as Jeremiah faced opposition from those who sought to silence him, we too may encounter resistance when we stand firm in our faith and speak out for righteousness. But let us take heart from Jeremiah's example and remember that God is with us, empowering us to overcome every obstacle in our path.

Like Jeremiah, we may experience moments of doubt and despair, questioning whether our efforts are in vain. Yet, even in our darkest hours, God remains faithful, His love sustaining us and His grace sufficient to see us through. As Jeremiah declared in verse 11a, "But the Lord is with me like a mighty warrior; so my persecutors will stumble and not prevail." (NIV)

Let us take hold of this promise and cling to it in times of trial. Though the road may be long and the journey arduous, we are not alone. The same God who sustained Jeremiah will uphold us, His strength made perfect in our weakness.

Just as Jeremiah remained obedient to God's calling despite the cost, so too are we called to persevere in our faith, trusting in the Lord's faithfulness and obeying His commands. Let us not be discouraged by the challenges we face, but rather let us be emboldened by the knowledge that God is for us, and if He is for us, who can be against us?

Dear Family of God,

1 Peter 1:23 says that we have been born again not of seed which is perishable but imperishable. Born again of the seed of God. First, let me say thanks to each of you who has been a part this ministry since its inception 2 1/2 years ago! Whether you have prayed, donated food, decorated, prepared food, served food, cleaned the kitchen, provided door prizes, been a speaker, or given financial support - your part in this ministry is invaluable!

Sometimes the program focuses on a devotion, and sometimes it's fun events, like movies, singing, games, or discussions pertaining to the aspects of widowhood. At this time we are averaging 40 attendees at each meeting, but we have more than 60 on the roster, and newcomers every month. Each month lunch is provided free of charge and the discussions around the lunch tables are inspiring, uplifting, and comforting. The sense of belonging in this group is beyond words!

One of my great joys is being able to organize this ministry! One of my greatest blessings is the army of volunteers who make it all happen! 
