Never Truly "Home Alone"

As Christmas approaches, many of us embrace traditions that make the season special—decorating the tree, baking cookies, and revisiting favorite holiday movies. In fact, it's not Christmas at our house until we watch the film Home Alone. You may get a kick out of this to learn that Home Alone is so beloved by Alyson that when she walked down the aisle as my bride, she did not do so to "Here Comes the Bride", but to Home Alone's theme song "Somewhere In My Memory". It isn't greenery which is the centerpiece of our living room for Christmas, instead it is a 4000 piece Lego replica of Kevin McCallister's home! To say that she's a fan is an understatement! In fairness, it's simply a humorous and heartfelt story of Kevin McCallister fending off burglars, but it also offers surprising nuggets of truth! As I was listening to the soundtrack of the movie to "get in the Christmas spirit", I thought I'd share a message of hope that is found in one of my family's favorite Christmas movies!

At its core, *Home Alone* highlights the pain of separation. Kevin's frustration

with his family leads to harsh words, and he wakes up wishing they were gone. However, he soon realizes that being separated from those he loves is more painful than he imagined.

This mirrors our spiritual reality. The Bible says, "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23, NKJV) Sin creates a chasm between us and our Heavenly Father. Like Kevin, we often act out of selfishness, causing separation in our relationships—both earthly and divine.

But Christmas reminds us that God did not leave us alone in our brokenness. Through the birth of Jesus, Emmanuel - "God with us" (Matthew 1:23, NKJV) - God came to bridge the gap, offering us reconciliation and the joy of restored relationship.

One of the most touching moments in *Home Alone* is when Kevin befriends his elderly neighbor, Mr. Marley. Kevin learns of Marley's estranged relationship with his son and encourages him to take a step toward reconciliation. By the film's end, we witness the joy of forgiveness and restored relationship.

This beautifully echoes the Gospel message of grace. Scripture reminds us,

"bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do." (Colossians 3:13, NKJV) At Christmas, we celebrate that God took the ultimate step toward us, offering forgiveness through His Son. And just as we have been forgiven, we are called to extend forgiveness to others.

Kevin's journey in *Home Alone* is one of transformation. He begins as selfish and self-centered but matures when left on his own. He prays for his family, decorates the tree, and even risks his safety

to protect his home. Kevin learned through his character arc to sacrifice.

Philippians 2:5-7 reminds us: "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men." (NKJV) Jesus gave up the glory of heaven to rescue us, the ultimate act of sacrificial love. This is the heart of the Christmas story.

This holiday season, as you watch *Home Alone* or other Christmas classics, take

time to reflect on the deeper themes they offer. Just as Kevin learns the importance of family, forgiveness, and love, we can celebrate the joy of reconciliation and redemption found in Christ.

And remember: no matter where you are or how alone you might feel, you are never truly "home alone." Through Jesus, Emmanuel, God is always with you.

19 "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen.

Make disciples who make disciples for Christ D2D

We call this passage the Great Commission as it is the charge Jesus gave His disciples before He ascended to heaven. In this command to action, His disciples were to, as they went about their daily lives, make disciples or introduce people to Jesus so they would receive His salvation; and then disciple those who were saved to do the same thing Jesus had instructed them to do... as they go, make disciples.

The statement "make disciples who make disciples" is an accurate sum-

mary of the command Jesus gave the 11 disciples (Matt 28:16), and that He also gives to us as His disciples today. This statement was presented to the congregation at the TIM session on November 24, 2024, as the TIM team's recommendation for the mission statement for TABC. It has been shared with the deacons, and they too agree this statement represents what we at TABC must be about. On December 18, 2024, the TIM team will officially recommend this statement be affirmed by those attending our church business meeting as the mission statement for TABC. Also at this meeting, the 2025 budget for TABC will be presented for affirmation.

Beginning the end of October, we have shared the string of biblical values from Genesis to Revelation that supports this mission. You have heard teachings that started with man has been created by God in the image of God. That humankind is broken and fallen people reject the Lordship of God. God's solution to that brokenness is His Son, Jesus Christ, who came to earth as a babe, lived a sinless life and was betrayed, crucified, died, rose from the dead and then ascended to His Father. By receiving Him as our Savior and Lord, our brokenness is made righteousness in Him, and we

enter into a relationship with the Father through Him.

As disciples of Christ, we abide in Him, abide in His love and obey Him. Just as Jesus' goal was to glorify His Father by doing the work His Father gave Him to do, we too glorify Jesus and the Father by becoming His fruit bearers, living our lives accomplishing His work through us. The core of that work is to be a witness of Christ.

From our mission statement, the TIM team will begin leading TABC to develop a vision for what we should look like in the short future. Then the team will lead as we examine current ministries and explore other ministry opportunities to fulfill the vision that expresses our mission of making disciples that make disciples, D2D.

You see, not only did Jesus come to us as the Messiah to provide salvation but He modeled in His 3+ years of ministry, before going to the cross, discipling His disciples so they would change the world by making disciples who make disciples for Christ.
