Here are some of the core themes we've explored, and how they apply right now:


- Faith in Action: James reminds us that faith isn't just something we say—it's something we do. In times of change, we're called to live out our trust in God with service, unity, and boldness.
- Wisdom from Above: Transitions require wisdom. James 3:17 describes the wisdom from heaven as pure, peaceable, gentle... full of mercy. May that kind of wisdom guide our leadership and decisions.
- Endurance in Trials: James opens with a call to "count it all joy" when facing trials. Why? Because endurance is being built. Whatever uncertainty lies ahead, we know that God is shaping us for greater maturity.
- Guarding Our Words: James calls us to be "slow to speak, slow to anger," and

- to use our words to build up, not tear down. In seasons of transition, gracious speech and active listening are more important than ever.
- Drawing Near to God: In James 4, we're told to "draw near to God, and He will draw near to you." What a promise! In changing times, God doesn't move away—He comes closer.
- Being Doers of the Word: James challenges us not just to hear sermons or read Scripture, but to live it. What better way to honor this season than by walking in obedience—together, faithfully, one step at a time?

Church family, the Lord has not brought us this far to leave us now. He is at work—in our children, in our youth, in our hearts, and in our church. June reminded us that the Church is alive, active, and filled with purpose. Let's carry that spirit forward. We may be in transition, but we are not in turmoil. God is faithful, and we trust Him to guide every step. As James teaches us, we're not just waiting for things to happen—we're stepping out in faith, speaking truth in love, and doing the good work He's set before us.

Let's walk forward, full of gratitude for what God has done and full of hope for what He will do next.

Happy July! Summer is in full swing here on campus. We've had a busy few weeks in the center and with Camp! Camp has already been on several field trips (see pictures below) and have been learning about people in the Bible who did everything for the glory of God (1 Corinthians 10:31). They've already learned about Noah, Moses, Abraham, and Joseph, and have many more to go. What is even more great about it is that each week they have memory verses to learn that go along with the lesson, and we have had several that have been able to recite them by the end of the week. What an amazing way to start their foundation in Christ!

Our theme verse, mentioned above, is about making sure that everything we do, we do for the glory of God. I think sometimes that is something that is easily forgotten. We forget that everything we do as Christians should give glory and honor to God. Instead, we often want to take all the credit or get mad if someone doesn't recognize a "job well done". When instead we should not be worried about getting the credit or boasting. We should be worried about if we did it for the right reasons. What glory does God get when all you hear is someone talking about what they did, and how great it was? Or even better, when we see or hear someone get mad because they did something, but think they didn't get the proper recognition or thanks? How does that give glory to God?

Matthew 5:14-16 (NKJV) says: "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." To me, this is saying it's not about our individual "light", but about the "light" that we share. It's not about what we get out of doing something good; it is about what good we are doing for others. It's not about "tootin' our own horns"; it is about giving the glory to God.

So, the next time you get upset because someone didn't thank you, or because you didn't get the recognition you think you deserve, remember, why did you do it in the first place? Did you do it for your own glory? Or, are you doing it for the glory of God? You may not ever get recognized while on earth for something you did, but if you have done all that you can for His honor and His glory, then the rewards will be waiting when we get to eternity!
