# **Heritage**

This is the time the Transition Team finishes the Congregational Profile and Pastoral Profile. We have valuable information from the History Focus Point, and we have conducted a 'Pastoral Leadership Expectations' sample survey so both initiatives are in process.

Families,

Happy August! As I am typing this out, we are in the process of gearing up for our TACS Conference. This is always an exciting event for us, and it allows the teachers to get valuable training to use here in their classes. I was asked to do a training session again this year and have chosen to do it on "The Whole-Brain Child" (by Daniel J. Siegel, M.D. and Tina Payne Bryson, Ph.D.). I recently had a counseling class that used this book, and I ended up loving it. It talks about the importance of brain integration and helping children learn to use all four sections of their brains (Left, Right, Upstairs, Downstairs). I think as early education educators it is important to understand how a child's brain works, and why they may act the way that they

do at times. Often, once a child "flips their lid," they need help learning how to calm themselves down, and this book goes through different strategies on how to help do that. Being able to help them can lead to them being able to have more control of their actions and emotions as they grow older, and that is something that I take very seriously.

Often, people take for granted what we do here at the Early Ed. Center. We are so much more than just "babysitters." We are teaching letters, numbers, shapes, sights, sounds, colors (the list really can go on and on); we are loving and caring for the kids when they get hurt or when they are stressed and scared; we care for them when they are sick, we wipe noses, clean hands and faces, put shoes on the same kids 100 times a day; and most importantly, we are pouring the love of Jesus into their little hearts and brains. Once that seed is planted, it will always be there. What does that have to do with brain integration? If I am dealing with a child who is having a meltdown (their downstairs brain has taken over), I am holding and loving on them (this affects their right brain), talking to them soothingly and calmly (this affects their left brain), asking them questions about what is going on (this affects the upstairs brain). This all allows their brains to reset (this means getting the downstairs brain calmed). Now, if in this process I am telling them how much we love them, and more importantly how much Jesus loves them, then someday when they are older and struggling, they may have a flash of a memory (thanks to the Hippocampus) that reminds them of the time that someone at our center told them that Jesus loves them and it helps calm them down. That is Brian Integration.

There are so many verses of Scripture that tell us about how God made us. He made us in His image (Genesis 1:27); He knew us when He formed us in our mother's womb (Jeremiah 1:5); and He has plans for us all (Jeremiah 29:11). He created our brains, and He has supplied ways for us to grow and nurture our own brains, as well as the ability to help and teach others. This is just another amazing reminder of what a Mighty God we Serve!

Please be in prayer for our Center, our Staff, and the Families as we get ready to start a new year!
