Love That Pursues and Restores

February draws our attention to love—but Scripture invites us to consider a kind of love far deeper than sentiment, romance, or momentary affection. The Bible presents love not merely as a feeling, but as a faithful, covenant commitment. One of the clearest and most challenging pictures of that love is found in the life and ministry of the prophet Hosea. Hosea's story is uncom-

fortable, raw, and deeply moving. God commanded him to love a wife who would be unfaithful—a living illustration of Israel's relationship with the Lord. Again and again, Gomer wandered. Again and again, Hosea pursued. This was not because she deserved it, but because God was revealing His own heart toward His people. Through Hosea, the Lord declares, *"I will heal their backsliding, I will love them freely..."* Hosea 14:4a, NKJV. That is the love of God—free, undeserved, and unwavering. It is a love that does not ignore sin, but one that moves toward restoration rather than rejection.

A love that disciplines, yet never abandons. A love that redeems what seems broken beyond repair. This is the same love ultimately revealed in Jesus Christ. Hosea points us forward to the Gospel—where God Himself steps into our brokenness, bears the cost of our unfaithfulness, and brings us back to Himself. At the cross, we see the fullest expression of covenant love: love that pays the price, love that brings us home, love that will not let go. As we reflect on this kind of love, we are also reminded that God calls His people not only to receive it, but to reflect it. True devotion to

God is always accompanied by love lived out in tangible ways—acts of compassion, mercy, and faithful service to others.

But I found another this past week that quickly became a "strength" verse for me. Psalm 143:8 says, *"Cause me to hear Your lovingkindness in the morning, For in You do I trust; Cause me to know the way in which I should walk, For I lift up my soul to You."* (NKJV)

Many of you know the medical battle we just went through with my brother. For a while we didn't know if he was going to make it. He was on a vent for 3.5 days, had a good day, then we had a few more bad days of hallucinations. It was scary and I think all I could see and hear was fear. I felt like our whole family, and a ton of others were in constant prayer. But for some reason when I prayed, I still felt the overwhelming sense of fear. Then I came across the verse in Psalms, and it was like a cool breeze washed over me, and I was able to take a breath. My trust, my faith was wavering. I wasn't listening to hear God's voice; I was listening to the fear in my heart. But that verse reminded me that God has shown Himself to me time and time again, and for some reason this time, in the middle of a crisis, I forgot. I forgot Who I am supposed to trust. I forgot to surrender everything to Him. It was like I was trying my best to make sense of it all, on my own. Proverbs 3:5-6 says, *"Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths."* (NKJV) All I needed to do was to let go and let God. And man, did He start to move.

My brother is home now, and has a long road ahead of him, but God had His hands around him and our whole family. It's funny how sometimes it takes hard times to remind us of God's love for us, and that we are to fully trust in Him. This whole experience was a huge lesson in trust, faith, and remembering Who we belong to. With that being said, I would like to thank all who were lifting him and our family up in prayers over the past week and half. Please continue to pray as he faces some major changes. I know that God will provide a way and will take care of him and the family in the days to come.

It is also reassuring to know I work for a ministry of God. I was reminded many times that people loved me, my family, and there were so many offers of help. It was a ray of light in a very dark time. I am sure many of you have faced similar dark times, and I pray that you were able to lean on God's love during that time. We may not always understand or have the answers, but we know beyond a doubt that God loves us.

My reminder to you in this month all about love, is to remember that it's not just all those around you who love you, but God loves you too, more than we can ever fathom.
